Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure (DPTI), in partnership with the Motor Accident Commission recently awarded further Community Grants for safer, greener and more active travel. The successful applicants for July 2016 are:

Helping Hand Aged Care Saving time, conserving energy and improving safety	With funds provided by the Motor Accident Commission, this project provides staff video conferencing equipment. This will reduce the need for staff and management to travel between sites in both city and country regions.	\$10,000.00
City of Mount Gambier Staff on Wheels	This project will support staff at the City of Mount Gambier to replace work car trips with riding a work bike to meetings and other work related destinations.	\$3883.35
Gawler Environment and Heritage Association Gawler Cycling	This project is designed to support women to regain confidence and to be comfortable in riding a bike. This will encourage participants to use bikes instead of car trips and to actively travel.	\$5,110.00
Good Country Physiotherapy Ride to work	This project will supply work bikes to reduce staff reliance on work cars, promoting healthy choices for staff. The staff being seen using active travel, will have a positive influence on the broader community.	\$2,000.00
District Council of Grant Connecting Up	With funds provided by the Motor Accident Commission, this project will provide video conferencing and presentation equipment for staff and local community at Port MacDonnell and the	\$11,302.70

District Council of Yankalilla Free Bikes	The District Council of Yankalilla was awarded a grant to establish a free bike hire scheme for the area to assist local residents and visitors to get about the town without a car. There will be two hire points, one within Yankalilla at the Visitors Information Centre and the other in Normanville.	\$13,420.00
Coorong District Council Wheels on Water	The Coorong District Council is establishing a free bike hire scheme to allow tourist to explore the local attractions of Meningie by bike instead of the car. The bikes will be available at the local Information Centre. Locals and Council staff will also be using the bikes to travel to meetings around town.	\$8,700.00
